### Housing

Housing is the basic necessity of every human being with food, water, and companionship. Everyone needs a home or shelter that provides privacy and protects human from harmful elements. It also provides quality of life and well-being as well as better chances of having sound health conditions. Further, housing is considered a criterion for the development of every individual of a nation.

As recognized by the international human rights law, adequate housing is one of the rights of the people to achieve the standard of living. Provision of affordable and decent housing units with the basic utilities and services to its residents is one of the challenges faced by the provincial government. Moreover, the provincial government accommodates the development of wide-range housing projects that would cater to different markets. Cavite also provides relocation sites to support qualified families that may be affected by the demolition undertaking initiated by the provincial government to protect those who established dwelling structures in the identified danger zones and have encroached roads right-away.

## **Housing Subdivisions**

The Housing and Land Use Regulatory Board (HLURB) is the country's primary government agency tasked with providing technical support in matters including, but not limited to housing regulations, land development and homeowners' associations, and settlement of land disputes. HLURB operates via a triad of strategies: policy development, planning, and regulations. Its services cater to homebuyers, developers, homeowners' associations, brokers and local government units.

HLURB, being the national government agency responsible for issuing Certificate of Registration and License to sell to real estate developers issued a total of 24 permits to four municipalities and five cities of the province. Cavite has a total of 6,613 House and Lots, 967 lots, and 3,902 house or lot. Moreover, the socialized and economic housing classification refers to the housing unit's affordability of low- and average-income level of the individual, while open market housing units is the opposite of the latter.

#### **Displaced Units**

Displaced units are the housing that needs to be relocate because it is in a danger zone, affected by the infrastructure projects, demolition with court order, or uninhabitable areas. The highest number with a displaced units based on National Housing Authority is the municipality of Naic with 1,944 followed by City of Bacoor with 1,293.

Based on HLURB, Cavite City has 4,029 housing units in danger zone, and 585 housing units affected by infrastructure, with the total of 4,614 displaced units. Meanwhile, Magallanes has 47 housing units in danger zone and 1,758 housing units affected by other situation, with a total of 1,805 displaced units. Also, Mendez has six units in danger zone and four units affected by the infrastructure with a total of ten displaced housing units.

#### Informal Settlers

Informal Settlers (IS) are the individuals or groups who can occupy a certain area illegally. Based on UN-Habitat (2016), slum areas often lack access to drinking waters, sanitation facilities, overcrowded houses, nondurable housing structures, and facilities that may lead to forced eviction.

Based on the data of the Provincial Housing Development and Management Office, the Province of Cavite has a total of 29,088 informal settlers as of 2020. Cavite City has the highest informal settler's families with 10,150, followed by the City of Dasmariñas and Kawit with 7,570 and 5,512, respectively. Fourteen municipalities and three cities in the

province have no record of informal settlers in their respective localities.

### **Resettlement Housing Projects**

Pursuant to Republic Act 7279, the National Housing Authority (NHA) is the national agency that provides technical and other forms of assistance to local government units (LGUs) in the implementation of their housing programs; to undertake identification, acquisition, and disposition of lands for socialized housing; and to undertake relocation and resettlement of families with local government units.

NHA and the Provincial Government of Cavite are partners in providing low-cost and socialized housing in the province. NHA manages 47 resettlement projects with 95,341 units in Cavite. Trece Martires City Resettlement Project, NHA's biggest resettlement housing project in Cavite, has 25,859 housing units followed by City of Dasmariñas and Naic with 24,750 units and 19,694 units, respectively. These resettlement housing projects were constructed for the informal settlers from Metro Manila, displaced families from the Railway Development Projects and other danger zones, and for the families who were affected by the Pasig River Rehabilitation Program. Employees of different LGUs, including PNP employees and other military personnel and public-school teachers, as well as informal settlers from different reclamation areas in the province, also benefitted from these housing projects.

### **Provincial Mass Housing Project**

A residential lot is the land use for residential purposes for family dwellings. Based on the definition provided by the law insider, a residential lot means a lot containing a residential use or a vacant lot that is zoned for residential use and meets the zone provisions for the permitted residential use (lawinsider.com).

Based on the data report from the Provincial Housing Development and Management Office (PHDMO), 1,440 vacant lots are available in five residential lot areas in the province. LRTA Santiago in City of General Trias has the most number of vacant lots with 1,376 lots, followed by Pinagkaisa in Kawit. In accordance, LRTA Santiago has the highest total number of lots with 1,869 lots.

According to the definition of terms provided by PHDMO, a vacant lot are the lot available for awarding. An original awardee is a person who was given allocation, while the illegal occupant is the person who is not awardee but occupies an awardee lot.

For the definition of cancellation, it is the awarded lot but not occupied while the term legal action means renters and buyers undergoing barangay hearing. Ongoing construction is the continuous construction of a dwelling unit by an awardee in an allocated lot. Deceased Original Awardee is the original awardee who passed away. Total number of lots is the sum of total lots in the relocation site.

The awarded lots are the lots that has an owner. The lot can either be occupied or not. Pinagkaisa has the highest number of awarded lots in 2020 with 786, followed by LRTA Santiago with 498 lots awarded. A total of 1,819 lots were awarded to different constituents of the province.

### **Housing Characteristics**

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) defined a housing unit as a structurally separate and independent place of abode for the habitation of a household. The types of housing units are single house, duplex, multi-unit residential (three units or more), commercial/industrial/agricultural (office, factory, etc.), institutional living quarters (hotel, hospital, etc.), and other housing units (boat, cave, etc.).

As of August 2015, Cavite has 851,871 occupied housing units. The occupied housing units increased by 23.75% from 688,290 occupied housing units as of May 2010. The increase in the number of housing units in Cavite may be attributed to the increasing population in the province due to influx of in-migration in the urban areas, such as City of Dasmariñas, City of Bacoor, and City of Imus.

In terms of cities and municipalities, most housing units in Cavite is in the City of Dasmariñas, having 145,166 occupied housing units. The City of Bacoor and City of Imus follow with 144,707 and 95,234 occupied housing units, respectively. The highest increase in the number of occupied housing units is in Trece Martires (39.48%). Trece Martires City also has the fastest population growth rate in the province.

Most housing units are single houses, covering 63.43% of the total occupied housing units, with a total household of 555,940 and a household population of 2,388,515. Multiunit residential housing units followed with 216,733 units. Moreover, there are 92 institutional living quarters in the province, housing 105 households, and 61 other housing units, housing 61 households. However, 200 occupied housing units are not reported in the province. The total occupied housing units also produced a ratio of 1.03 across households and 4.30 to household population. It indicates that, in average, there are 103 household in every 100 housing units and 430 persons in every 100 housing units.

#### **Makeshift Housing**

A makeshift housing unit is an independent, improvised housing unit. It is temporary and usually built of waste materials without a predetermined plan for habitation by a household. The occupied housing units with walls made of light materials such as bamboo, sawali, cogon, nipa,

makeshift materials, trapal, and without wall were considered the makeshift dwelling units.

A total of 14,317 housing units in Cavite is considered a makeshift housing unit. It accounted for 1.68% of the total occupied housing units in the province. The City of Bacoor

has the most with 1,530 units, followed by Silang (1,279) and Naic (1,171). However, in terms of percentage in total occupied housing units, Magallanes has the largest with 16.01%. Maragondon (11.80%) and General Emilio Aguinaldo (10.22%) followed.

## **Public Order and Safety**

# Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement

Article II, Section 5 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution declared that "the maintenance of peace and order, the protection of life, liberty, and property, and the promotion of the general welfare are essential for the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy."

Pursuant to this, the provincial government and aims to maintain and further strengthen the entire province's safety, security and peace. The Provincial Government of Cavite enhances peace, order, and public safety of the whole society through concerted efforts of the Cavite Police Provincial Office, government agencies, private agencies, and the communities' active participation.

#### **Police Personnel**

The Cavite Police Provincial Office is the lead agency in implementing peace and order and internal security in the whole province.

As of 2020, Cavite Provincial Police is composed of a total of 2,299 police personnel consisting of 115 Police Commissioned Officers (PCOs) and 2,184 Police Non-Commissioned Officers (PNCOs).

The ideal police to population ratio is one policeman for every 1,000 population (1:1000) for urban cities and municipalities. Cavite has a 2020 population of 4,344,829 based on the 2020 Census of Population conducted by the Philippine Statistics Authority. As a result, the province has a 1:1,890 police-to-population ratio showing a shortage of 2,046 uniformed personnel. Based on the table, the largest shortage is observed in the City of Dasmariñas (642), followed by the City of Bacoor (474), and the City of Imus (350). In terms of ratio, Cavite City, Tagaytay City, General Emilio Aguinaldo, Ternate, Magallanes, Amadeo, and Mendez conform to the minimum standard of the police-to-population ratio.
