# Chapter VII. Infrastructure Sector

#### TRANSPORT

The vitality of transport means and transportation networks are very important for any province, thus having an efficient and effective transport system, access roads and traffic circulation is a good indicator of a well-organized province and is an added factor for investment that will likely lead to development.

The province's transport infrastructure has kept on moving with the increasing industrial and commercial activities which sometimes results to quilts of urban sprawl, traffic congestion and increased road accidents. From this, more transportation facilities, better traffic control systems and road signages are provided by the provincial government.

#### Roads and Bridges

Generally, the transportation system in the Province of Cavite is predominantly land-based, of which the main transport mode is road-based. The roads are classified into national, provincial, city/municipal, and barangay roads. The national roads form part of the trunkline systems and are connected by provincial roads from one city/municipality to another, and the city/municipal roads interlink barangays.

Cavite's total road network comprises roughly 2,222.0714 kilometers wherein 18.20 percent or 404.3580 kilometers are national roads while 370.6770 kilometers or 16.68 percent are provincial roads. Most of these roads are surfaced with concrete or asphalt. Moreover, 90.22 percent or 287.9257 kilometers of the city/municipal roads are paved with concrete while majority of the 1,127.9041 kilometers barangay roads are earthfill and concrete roads. Table 7.1 shows the total road length of the province in 2008 (Table 7.1).

Cavite has six (6) major entrances and exits: the Aguinaldo Boulevard (Manila-Cavite Coastal Road), South Luzon Expressway (SLEX) in Carmona, the Aguinaldo Highway (Batangas-Alfonso-Tagaytay Road), the Zapote-Las Piñas Road, the Sta. Rosa-Tagaytay Road, and the Alabang-Molino via Daang Hari Road.

Table 7.2 shows that there are 311 bridges which connect roads in different cities and municipalities of the province. These are also classified as national, provincial, city/municipal and barangay bridges wherein 255 or 89.99 percent of these have permanent structures having a total length of 4,917.94 linear meters while 56 or 18.01 percent are temporary structures registering a total length of 1,093.15 linear meters (Table 7.2).

#### **Transport Facilities**

Based on 2009 data gathered from Land Transportation Office (LTO), Region IV in Lipa City, Batangas, there are 208,718 units of motor vehicles registered in the province by which 39.74 percent or 82,944 units are registered in Imus District Office while 24.19 percent or 50,494 units are in Cavite City District Office. Tagaytay City District Office reflects a total of 41,032 units and Dasmariñas City Office has a total of 34,248 units or 16.40% share. These vehicles which regularly ply the roads in the province include cars, utility vehicles, sports utility vehicle, trucks, buses, motorcycle/tricycle and trailers (Table 7.3).

Table 7.4 shows that LTO Cavite has issued 89,559 licenses by which 55,565 or 62.04 percent are professional licenses while 37.96 percent or 33,994 are non-professional licenses. Permits issued are categorized as student and conductor permits with 36,109 and 464 issuances, respectively which result to a total of 126,132 issued licenses and permits.

### COMMUNICATION

Telecommunication and postal services add to the sophistication of various establishments located in the province. These services are also useful at home, schools and government and private offices. Telephone services are being provided mostly by the Philippine Long Distance Telephone Company (PLDT), Digital Telecommunications Philippines, Inc. (DIGITEL) and Globe Telecommunications.

Data gathered from the City/Municipal Planning and Development Offices show that Cavite has 342 cell sites strategically located all over the province. District VII tops among the seven districts with 84 cellsites followed by Districts VI and V with 81 and 57 cellsites, respectively. Details of these are presented on Table 7.5 and 7.6. Telecommunication services in the province are provided by Radio Communication of the Philippines, Incorporated (RCPI), Philippine Telegraph and Telephone Company (PT & T), LBC Forwarder and DHL Forwarder.

Based on 2008 data gathered from National Telecommunications Commission, Batangas City, operating radio stations available in Cavite were categorized as to AM Broadcasting, FM Broadcasting, and Low Power (Community Radio) Station (Table 7.7). Philippine Telegraph and Telephone Company (PT & T); LBC Express, Inc. and DHL Forwarder also perform specific telecommunication services throughout the province. The Philippine Postal Corporation takes postal service in the cities/municipalities of Cavite. Records gathered from this office show that there are 34 post offices in the province responsible for posting and delivering a total of 10,698,719 mails wherein 9,996,445 are domestic mails and 702,274 are international mails (Table 7.8). Telegraph services are provided under the supervision of the Bureau of Telecommunications.

## POWER

The electric power of the entire province of Cavite is being supplied by the National Power Corporation (NPC) through the Manila Electric Company (MERALCO). All towns down to all barangays of Cavite has access to electric power supplied by Meralco, thus giving the province's energization rate to 100 percent.

Table 7.9 shows the total number of connections in Cavite totaling to 626,969. These are categorized as residential having 93.22 percent of the total connections or 584,464, commercial with 41,312 connections, industrial registering 559 connections and streetlight having 634 connections. Of the seven districts, District IV has the largest number of customer count with 124,491 connections followed by District VI with 117.477

### WATER SUPPLY

Water in Cavite is supplied by different service agencies. Maynilad Water Services, Incorporated serve the municipalities of Noveleta, Imus, Bacoor, Kawit, Rosario and Cavite City. Water Districts under Local Water Utilities Administration (LWUA) supply the municipalities of Mendez, Indang, Silang, Gen. Mariano Alvarez, Maragondon, Tanza, Carmona, Amadeo, Gen. Aguinaldo, and the cities of Dasmariñas, Tagaytay and Trece Martires. Likewise, there are private corporations operating as water service providers in the province like General Trias Water Corporation in Gen. Trias, Naic Water System Corporation in Naic and Western Cavite Water Supply and Service Corporation in Ternate, while the municipal governments of Alfonso and Magallanes manage their respective water supply systems (Table 7.10). Commonly, barangays which are not reached by the services of the previously mentioned agencies have their own barangay waterworks and sanitation associations (BWSAs). Other households have their own level system or point source systems which are evident from the data gathered from Provincial Health Office indicating the number of households with access to safe drinking water using level I, level II and level III water system which total to 467,310 (Table

### IRRIGATION

The National Irrigation Administration (NIA) was created under Presidential Decree No. 552 and Cavite Friar Lands Irrigation System (CFLIS) became one of the National Irrigation Systems being managed by NIA. Municipalities served by CFLIS with firmed up-service area (FUSA) of 8,489.59 hectares include Ternate, Maragondon, Naic, Tanza, Gen. Trias, Imus, Dasmarinas City and Bacoor (Table 7.12). Moreover, the municipalities which are being served by the Cavite Provincial Irrigation Office/Communal Irrigation Systems include Ternate, Maragondon, Gen. M. Alvarez and Carmona (Table 7.13). Records also indicate that the major irrigation facilities in the system consist of 18 diversion dams, 72 minor dams, 2 reservoirs and conveyance canals including appurtenant structures.
